Featured Spotlight: WCS Scores Big with the Bench Mob Bonus


Community support just made a slam dunk.


Wisconsin Community Services (WCS) recently received a game-changing gift thanks to the Bench Mob Bonus, a season-long

Melissa Heath began her journey at WCS as a Peer Specialist and now supervises a team of 12 within the Comprehensive Community Services (CCS) program, supporting nearly 300 individuals annually. She also oversees four supported housing sites, all of which have seen major improvements under her leadership.

Melissa launched WCS's new Peer Specialist Academy and leads the agency's Empathy Interview initiative, helping WCS stay connected to the voices



of those we serve. Even during staffing shortages, she stepped in to ensure quality care and support continued.

Beyond her programs, Melissa regularly organizes drives for clothing, food, and holiday gifts; securing over 100 gift cards last season alone.

In recognition of her outstanding work, Melissa was awarded the UWM Milwaukee Community Change Maker Scholarship. WCS is proud to celebrate her leadership, compassion, and commitment to lasting impact.



Report Spotlight: The State of Mental Health in America

Mental Health America's 2024 report reveals that nearly 60 million U.S. adults experienced a mental health need in the past year, with over 28 million not receiving treatment. Among youth aged 12–17, 1 in 5 had at least one major depressive episode, and more than half did not receive any mental health services.

These findings underscore the urgent need for improved access to mental health care nationwide.
